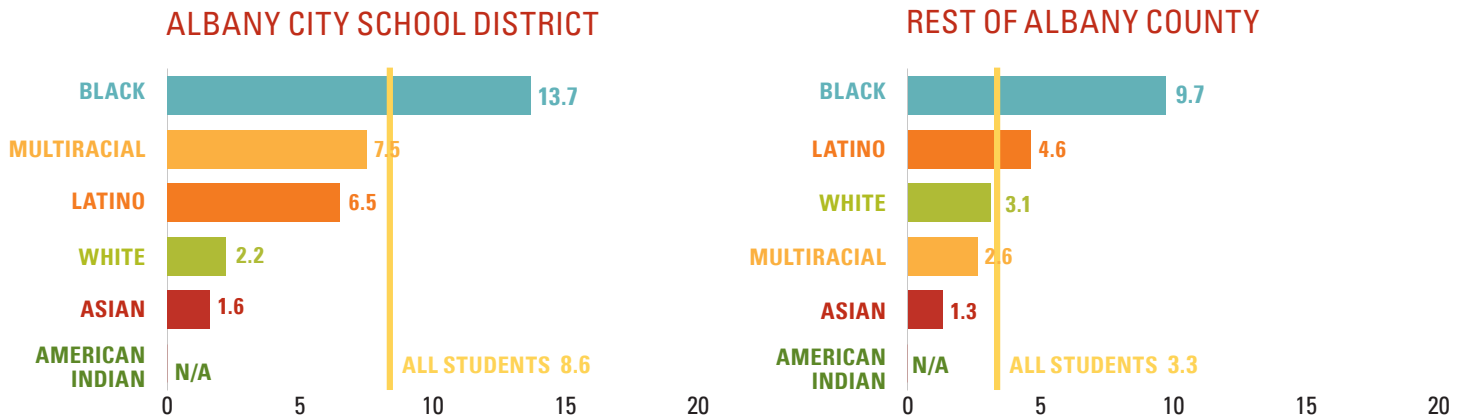
NEW YORK STATE'S SUSPENSION CRISIS

PERCENT OF STUDENTS WITH AT LEAST ONE OUT-OF-SCHOOL SUSPENSION (2016-17)

SCHOOLS DISPROPORTIONATELY SUSPENDED BLACK STUDENTS IN 2016-17

In the Albany City School District, Black students represented... **47% OF ENROLLMENT**

75% OF ALL STUDENTS WHO WERE SUSPENDED AT LEAST ONCE

In the rest of Albany County, Black students represented... **5% OF ENROLLMENT**

15% OF ALL STUDENTS WHO WERE SUSPENDED AT LEAST ONCE

THE IMPACT ON BLACK FEMALE AND BLACK MALE STUDENTS

At the **elementary/middle school level**, schools in the **Albany City School District** were **13.9X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.

At the **high school level**, schools in the **Albany City School District** were **6.3X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.

At the **elementary/middle school level**, schools in the **Albany City School District** suspended **14.9** percent of Black male students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.

At the **high school level**, schools in the **rest of Albany County** suspended **18.4 percent** of Black male students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.
