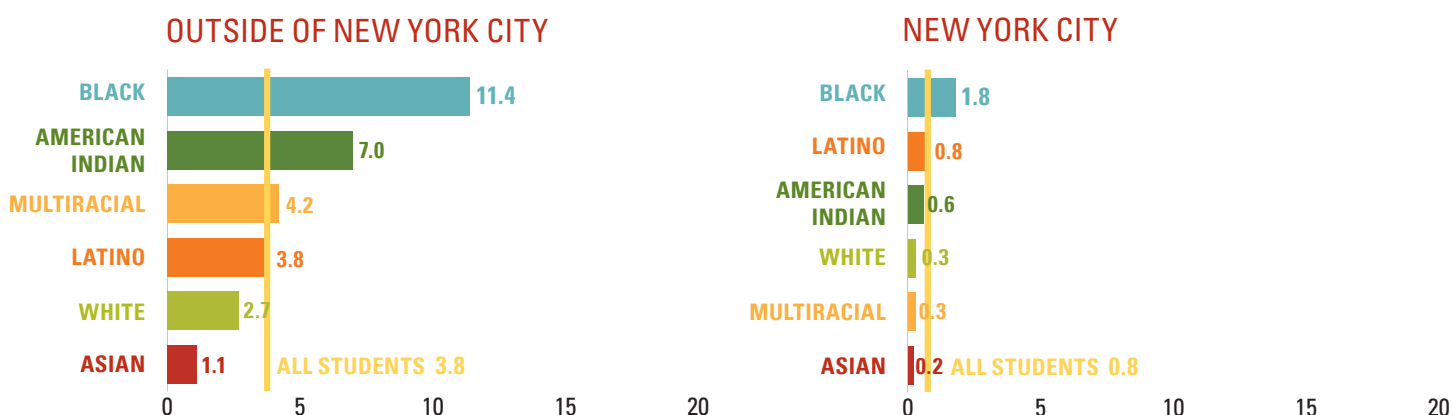

SCHOOLS DISPROPORTIONATELY SUSPENDED BLACK STUDENTS IN 2016-17

Outside of New York City, Black students represented...

10% OF ENROLLMENT



31% OF ALL STUDENTS WHO WERE SUSPENDED AT LEAST ONCE



In New York City, Black students represented...

23% OF ENROLLMENT



50% OF ALL STUDENTS WHO WERE SUSPENDED AT LEAST ONCE



THE IMPACT ON BLACK FEMALE AND BLACK MALE STUDENTS

At the **elementary/middle school level**, schools **outside of New York City** were **7.7X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.

Outside of New York City, schools suspended **11 percent** of Black male **elementary/middle school** students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.

At the **high school level**, schools **outside of New York City** were **5.4X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.

Outside of New York City, schools suspended **19 percent** of Black male high school students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.
