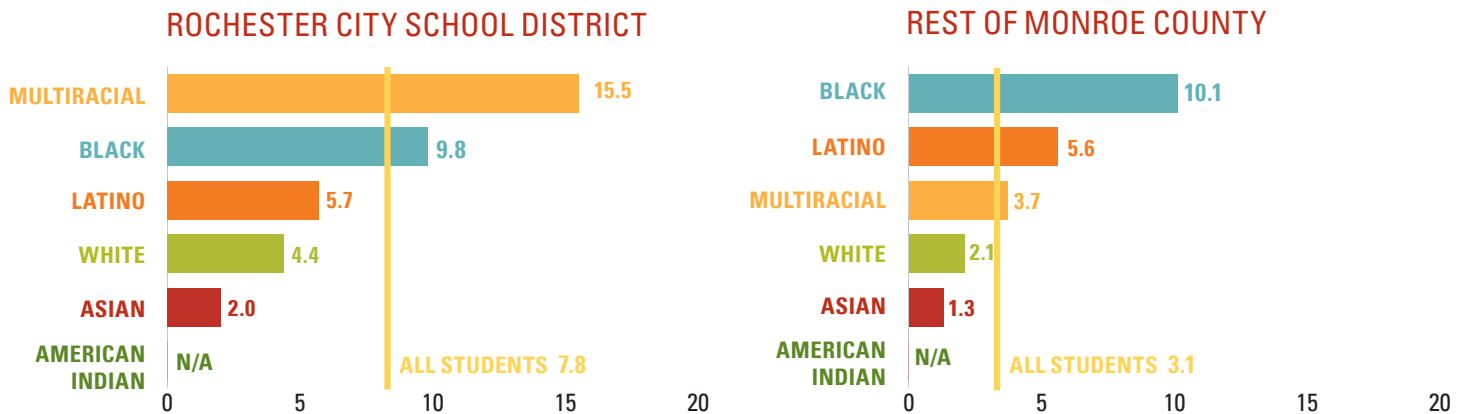

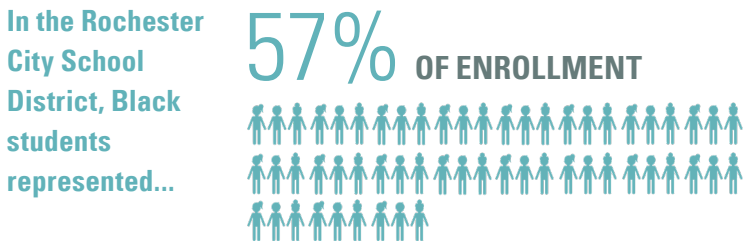

THE IMPACT ON BLACK FEMALE AND BLACK MALE STUDENTS

At the **elementary/middle school level**, schools in the **rest of Monroe County** were **7.6X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.

At the **high school level**, schools in the **rest of Monroe County** were **5.1X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.

At the **elementary/middle school level**, schools in the **rest of Monroe County** suspended **9.2 percent** of Black male students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.

At the **high school level**, schools in the **rest of Monroe County** suspended **21.7 percent** of Black male students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.
