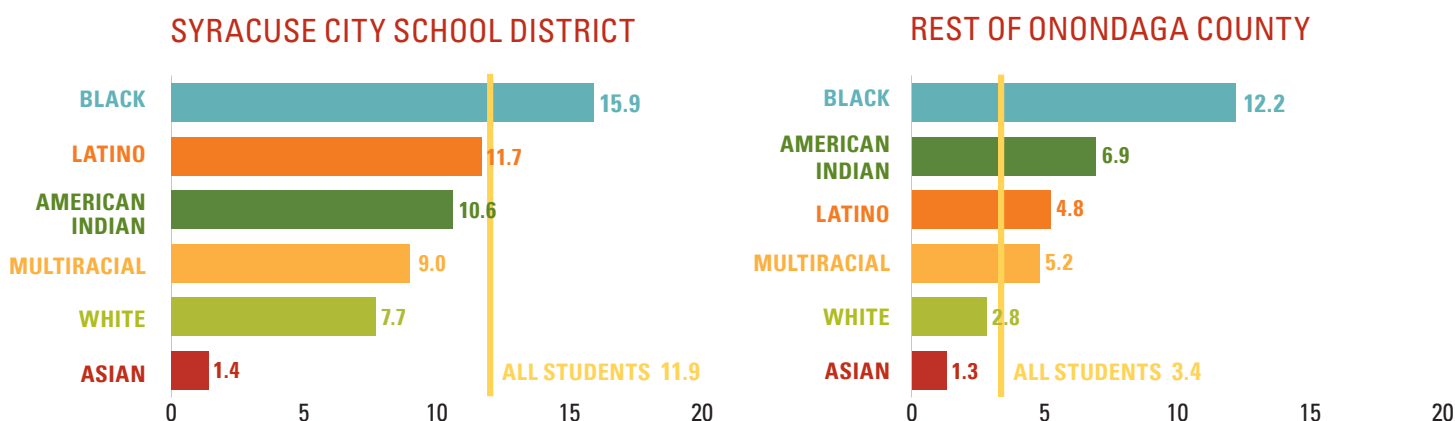

SCHOOLS DISPROPORTIONATELY SUSPENDED BLACK STUDENTS IN 2016-17

In the Syracuse City School District, Black students represented...

50% OF ENROLLMENT



67% OF ALL STUDENTS WHO WERE SUSPENDED AT LEAST ONCE



In the rest of Onondaga County, Black students represented...

4% OF ENROLLMENT



16% OF ALL STUDENTS WHO WERE SUSPENDED AT LEAST ONCE



THE IMPACT ON BLACK FEMALE AND BLACK MALE STUDENTS

At the **elementary/middle school level**, schools in the **Syracuse City School District** suspended **14.1 percent** of Black male students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.

At the **elementary/middle school level**, schools in the **rest of Onondaga County** were **6.0X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.

At the **high school level**, schools in the **Syracuse City School District** suspended **26.5 percent** of Black male students, which is a greater rate than any other group of students.

At the **high school level**, schools in the **rest of Onondaga County** were **5.8X** more likely to suspend Black female students than White female students.
